The Forest Heritage Center Museum is located in the heart of Beavers Bend State Park near Broken Bow. Designated as the "Wood Art Capital of Oklahoma," the educational forestry message is conveyed through a series of 14 large acrylic dioramas painted by well-known Smokey Bear artist Harry Rossoll. The museum houses antique forestry tools, wood art, homestead memorabilia, a bronze fallen firefighter sculpture & a 20-foot Indian statue. The People of the Forest Gallery depicts the early years of the forest industry, as well as the story of the traveling timber towns & the accomplishments of the Civilian Conservation Corps in McCurtain County.
